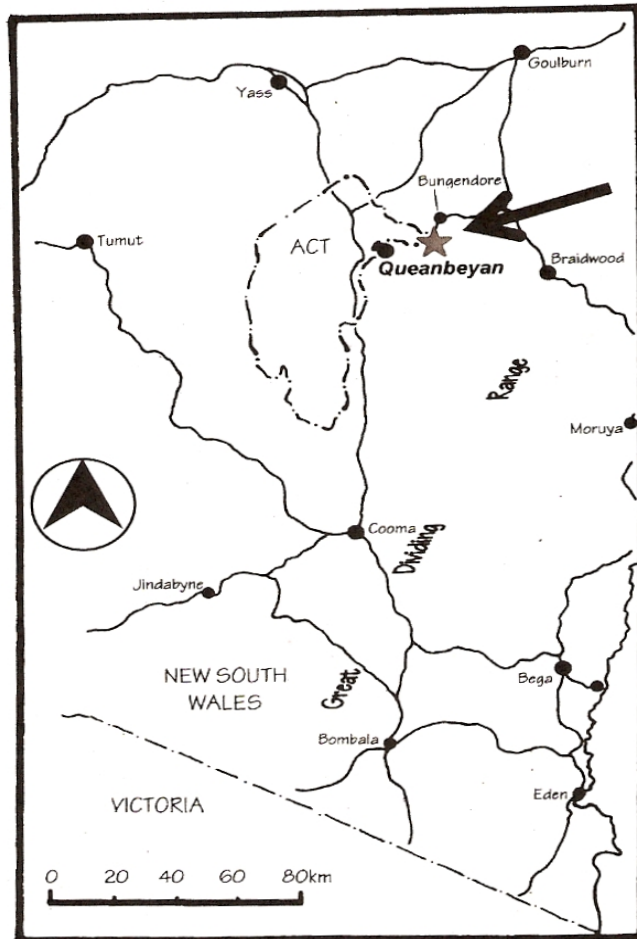


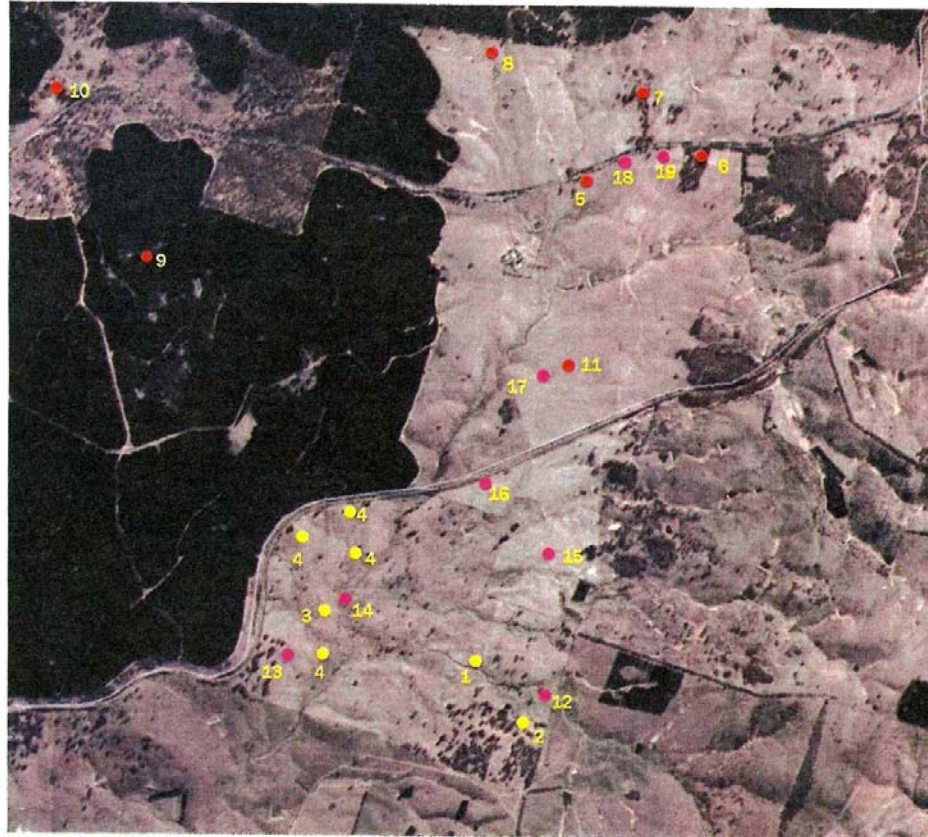
Figure 1.1. Location of the study area

- Altered our understanding of cons



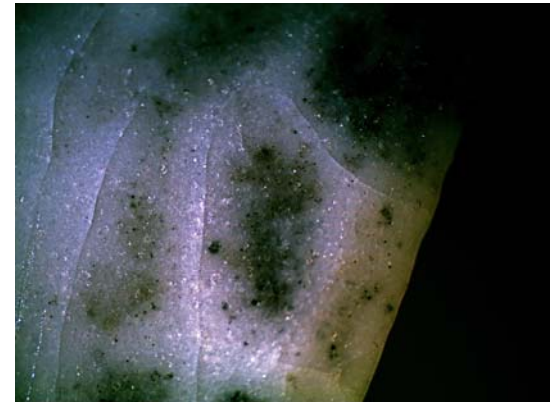
Dirt is Good

- Manufacturing techniques



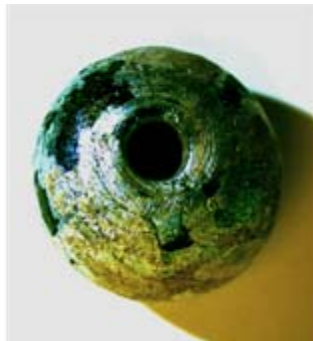
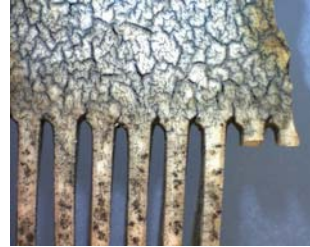
Restoration gives another POV
